Camping Permits (Refunds):

- There will be no camping on Pikes Peak-America's Mountain in 2020.
- If you purchased a Camping Permit online, you will automatically receive a refund.

Fan Fest:

- Fan Fest has been canceled for 2020.

Hiking:

- **New for 2020** - For the safety of our competitors and those who hike on Pikes Peak, on Practice Days (August 25-28) no hiking is permitted prior to 9:00 am.
- Trail #753 from Devils Playground to the summit of Pikes Peak, will be temporarily closed at Devils Playground on Sunday, August 30th. The temporary closure is necessary for public safety reasons during the 98th Running of the Pikes Peak International Hill Climb. **The temporary trail closure will be in effect on Sunday, August 30, 2020 from 12:01am until 6:00pm.** Barr Trail #620 will be open to the summit of Pikes Peak. Access to the summit and the Summit House may be restricted. Please contact the Pikes Peak Ranger District Office (719-636-1602) for more information.
- Signage will be posted at the following trailheads:
 - The Craggs Trail
 - Barr Trail
 - Catamount Trail
- Law enforcement officers on Pikes Peak will ask hikers to move back down the trails as no one is allowed along the course or in any area on Race Day.

Tickets (Refunds):

- No spectators will be admitted in 2020.
- If you purchased a Practice Day or Race Day ticket, you will automatically receive a full refund.
