



013 – 2020 Pikes Peak - America's Mountain Highway Protocol Bulletin

Please note that Pikes Peak – America's Mountain has implemented construction and traffic protocols, including mandatory shuttle buses, to ease traffic.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

The following will be strictly enforced:

- Under no circumstances is the parking lot at Santa's Workshop to be used for parking of any passenger vehicles, race vehicles, and/or trailers, of competitors and/or teams, at any time.
- Competitors are not allowed to pit and/or park on any portion of the Pikes Peak Highway road surface at any time. All competitors need to be parked and pitted in the designated parking and/or pit parking spaces.
- The speed limit on the Pikes Peak Highway is strictly enforced. Speeding on the Pikes Peak Highway may result in a PPIHC penalty and/or fine as well as denying access to the Highway by Pikes Peak – America's Mountain staff.
- During practice and testing, when coming downhill between runs, competitors must stay in their lane, follow two-way traffic rules, and drive at, or under, the posted speed limit.
- When testing and practice sessions are over, it is imperative to remember that tourists are driving up the Pikes Peak Highway and the road is open to the general public. Two-way traffic rules are in place, and competitors must use extreme caution when going downhill.
- The road is turned over to Pikes Peak - America's Mountain at 8:30am on **August 7th and 9th and 9:00am on August 14-16 as well as all practice days**. Competitors must be prepared to depart their designated pit area by 9:00am on August 7th and 9th and **10:30am on August 14-16 as well as all practice days**.

- If competitors wish to spend additional time on Pikes Peak - America's Mountain past 9:00am (August 7,9) and 10:00am (August 14-16, 25-28) they must exit the Pikes Peak Highway and re-enter through the Gateway after paying the toll and exhibiting the PPIHC Competitor Highway Pass. This pass is the only way, Pikes Peak - America's Mountain staff will know that you are a competitor and therefore, do not have to take the mandatory shuttle. One (1) PPIHC Competitor Highway Pass, good only for 2020 Competitors during regular highway hours, will be included in your Registration packet. If additional passes are needed, please contact alex@ppihc.org and she can e-mail you a pass to print out.
- If you will be in Colorado Springs, prior to Race Week, and want to drive the Pikes Peak Highway, please e-mail alex@ppihc.org and she can e-mail you a pass to print out. Again, this will be the only way the Highway staff will know you do not have to ride the mandatory shuttles. You will need to pay the toll with each use, as this will not be a complimentary pass, it only allows access to the road in a personal vehicle so you may drive the road without taking the shuttle. Annual passes are available for purchase if you plan to access the mountain frequently.
- Only street legal cars (not trailers) will be allowed on the Pikes Peak Highway during public hours. Drivers must obey all posted speed limits and traffic laws. If any competitor is found on the mountain, without having paid the toll during public hours and/or is cited for violating any traffic laws, they may be subject to a PPIHC penalty, fine, and/or disqualification.
- No special event filming, photography, or other special activities are allowed without the express written approval of the Pikes Peak – America's Mountain Manager or designee.
- One (1) Free Admission Voucher (yellow) to Pikes Peak – America's Mountain will also be included in your registration packet. All standard Pikes Peak Highway protocols (including shuttles) will be implemented when using this voucher.

Pikes Peak - America's Mountain is a public toll road 364 days a year. We must respect the time we are allowed to use the road and surrounding areas. Competitors who do not adhere to these rules may be penalized.
